He has written a number of books on environmental law subjects and has appeared in many of the recent leading cases on environmental law. His books include: *Environmental Assessment* (2004), *Nuclear Law* (publishing early 2010) and *Contaminated Land* (2nd edition, 2008). Recent cases include: *Transco* (contaminated land, House of Lords, 2007), *OSS* (waste, Court of Appeal, 2007), *Edwards* (pollution control and environmental assessment, House of Lords, 2008), *Hinton Organics* (Court of Appeal, costs in environmental cases, 2009) and *Lymington River Association* (High Court, habitats, 2010).
