Public Inquiries

Scarlett has been instructed in a number of the most significant public inquiries in recent years, typically acting for high profile Core Participants. She acts on behalf of victims and their families in the Infected Blood Inquiry, and previously acted for the Department of Health and Social Care in the Covid-19 Inquiry. She also has extensive experience of acting as Counsel to the Inquiry, having acted as Junior Counsel to the Grenfell Tower Inquiry.

Her extensive inquiry experience includes:

- Swiftly identifying the key issues likely to be raised during an inquiry, and advising on the same
- Amassing large volumes of disclosure by creating strategic, targeted systems of review, in line with the inquiry's key issues
- Creating disclosure systems for those with extensive and/or archived documentation
- Managing teams of paralegals and junior barristers (having once led a team of 50 individuals while operating under significant time pressure)
- Preparing witnesses for giving evidence to an inquiry
- Assisting with the cross examination of high-profile individuals

Inquests

Her inquest experience covers a broad range of factual and legal scenarios, typically in which Article 2 is engaged and juries are empanelled, including:

- Police misconduct and/or negligence;
- Deaths in state custody;
- Self-inflicted deaths;
- Defective products;
- Health and safety issues, including building construction; and
- Clinical negligence

Her strong civil liability practice means she is ideally suited for clients who require advice on inquest proceedings as well as any connected civil proceedings which may arise following a death. Notable ongoing cases in this field include:

- Representing the family of Jack Bristow, who died at work when he was hit by a large tree during Storm Eunice
- Representing the family of Matthew Boorman, who was murdered by his neighbour. The murderer gave the police advance notice of his intentions
- Representing the family of Michaela Hall, who was murdered by her partner following an extensive history of domestic abuse involving a number of state agencies

Scarlett's public law practice includes judicial review and statutory review challenges to coronial decisions. She acted as sole counsel in <u>HM Senior Coroner for South London v HM Assistant Coroner for South</u> <u>London [2022] EWHC 1388 (Admin)</u>, in which the Divisional Court clarified the ambit of the High Court's powers following an amendment to s.13 of the Coroners' Act 1988. She is currently acting for the Chief Coroner in a judicial review challenge which takes issue with the accuracy of one of his Guidance Sheets.
