David Feldman's research and teaching interests cover a wide range of public law fields, including administrative law, civil liberties, constitutional law (particularly in an international and comparative perspective) and human rights. He is currently examining the relationship between law, politics and public administration, the nature of constitutions, constitutionalism and constitutional legislation, the birth and development of states, and the ways in which jurisdictional errors affect the validity of administrative rules and decisions. He was an international Judge of the Constitutional Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina from 2002 until 2010, and Legal Adviser to the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Human Rights in the Westminster Parliament from 2000 to 2004.
